

Instructions for Authors

Submission of manuscripts

Manuscripts should be sent by e-mail to the editors along with a covering letter delineating the scope of your submitted article and competing interests. To expedite the review process, authors will also be prompted to nominate three potential referees, not collaborators, to serve as potential referees.

Submission of a manuscript to *Scientific Journal SLP* implies that it is not being considered for publication elsewhere, except in the form of an abstract or academic thesis, and the authors have a necessary authorization to publish the material contained in the paper. Please, indicate who the corresponding author is. Include telephone and fax numbers and the complete postal address. Full postal addresses and email addresses must be given for all co-authors.

A single *.doc file containing text, references, figures, tables etc. should be sent. Please, use the International System of Units (SI).

After the manuscript has been accepted for publication, the authors will be requested to send the final version in a *.pdf file containing the complete manuscript, carefully checked.

Manuscript

The manuscript should contain the following information:

Title of the paper

Affiliation of the authors

E-mail of the corresponding author

Abstract

Keywords (5)

Introduction

Experimental and/or model

Results

Discussion

Conclusions

References

Appendixes

Acknowledgments

Etc.

The references should be numbered consecutively by Arabic numerals in square brackets ([1]; [3, 4]; [7–11]). The list of references should follow the main text and should have the following format:

For a paper in a journal:

[1] T. Kitamura, M. Yokoyama. *J. Appl. Phys.* 69 (1991), 821.

Journal abbreviations should be in accordance with the standards of *Chemical Abstracts*.

For a book:

[2] R. A. Swalin. *Thermodynamics of Solids*, Wiley, New York, 1962.

For a chapter in a book:

[3] U. P. Wild, A. Renn. *Spectral Hole-Burning*. H. Dürr and H. Bouas-Laurent (Eds.),

Photochromism. Molecules and Systems, Elsevier, Amsterdam, 1990, p. 930.

Equations

All equations should be generated by a equation editor. Equations referred to in the text should be numbered consecutively at the right hand margin with Arabic numerals in parentheses.

Tables

Tables should be numbered consecutively with Arabic numerals. Each table should be given a descriptive caption. If the tables are grouped at the end of the main text, then an approximate position of each table should be indicated in the text.

Figures and graphs

All figures should be numbered with Arabic numerals, have descriptive captions, and be mentioned in the text. An approximate position for each figure should be indicated in the text. All figures submitted must be of a high quality. Letters and symbols should be so drawn that the smallest ones will be perfectly visible.

The reviewers submit their reports on the manuscripts along with any of the following recommendations:

Publish Unaltered

Publish after Minor Changes

Review Again after Major Changes

Reject: Manuscript is flawed or not sufficiently novel
